

This prize is offered annually by the Delany Archive Trust, in memory of Fr Mc Donnell its first chairperson. He was a former Vice-President of this College who died in 2012 as Parish Priest of Naas, Sallins and Two Mile House.

Award for BA in Arts and Humanities

This Award is given to the student who has achieved a Distinction and first place on this degree.

Gerry Morgan Award in Applied Social Studies for Excellence in Practice Placement

This award is named in honour of Gerry Morgan, College lecturer, who died in 2020.

Dr Anne Holton Award in Teaching Excellence

This Award is named in honour of Dr Anne Holton RSM who taught Catechetics in the College from the mid-1970s.

Robert Frederick Holmes (1803) Award

This Award is named in honour of college student Robert Frederick Holmes who gave his life while attempting to save the life of a fellow student.

James Fintan Lalor Student of the Year Award

This Award is named in honour of the social and agrarian radical, political theorist, and Young Irelander, James Fintan Lalor who was a student of the College in the 1820s.
